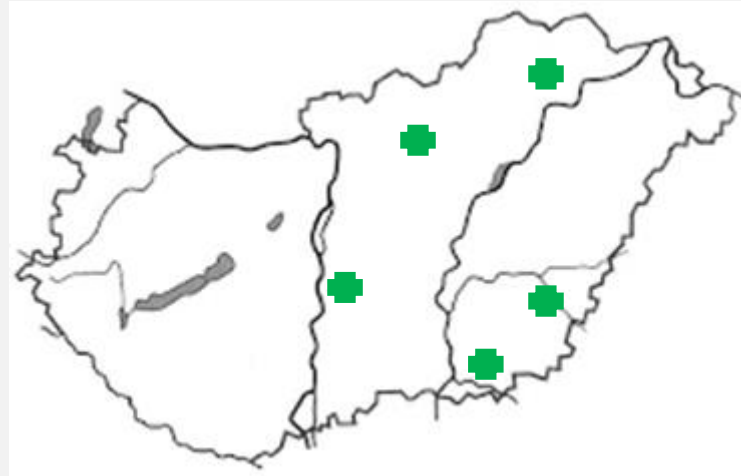

<b>Percent of patient completed third consultation</b>	<b>41%</b>
<b>Mean age of patient (years)</b>	<b>61</b>
<b>Female / male ratio</b>	<b>70/30</b>
<b>Mean number of used drug</b>	<b>9.25</b>
<b>Maximum number of used drug</b>	<b>20</b>
<b>Percentage of revealed DRP (after first consultation)</b>	<b>32%</b>

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# PHARMACISTS' FEEDBACK

## Challenges:

- ✓ **Time** constraints
- ✓ Extra efforts required for **documentation** (electronic data entry, software updates)
- ✓ **GP`s** reluctance to take advice on therapy
- ✓ **Patients** are keen to get included and participate in the first consultation but frequently miss further appointments
